Bessie's bonus Horsham July 13

AUNTY BESSIE picked up the GOBIS Bonus by taking out the 570 metres Grade 5 Final on Tuesday night.

Sent to box five at \$3.40, the Bob Smith owned and trained chaser saluted by a length over Inventory (\$3.80), with One Eyed Red (\$24.30) a half length further adrift.

Aunty Bessie, a daughter of Where's Pedro and Amber Rhode, clocked 33.24 to make it three wins in 13 outings to date.

Rock And Rolla collected the GOBIS Bonus by taking out the 480 metres Maiden Final.

The son of Shanlyn Prince and Jonny Allen wore the yellow vest at \$6.50 to a length and three quarters win over Capparis Bale (\$4.50), with Ballistic Maz (\$39.60) three lengths further afield.

The Darren Fisher trained sprinter came from box eight at \$3.60 to lead throughout and score by three and three quarter lengths over Saffron Sweetie (\$22.50), with Cool Card (\$5.70) picking up third money, two and three quarter lengths further afield.

A winner of seven of her 34 starts, Sassi Jay is a daughter of Exceptional and Sassi Who, owned by Don Jarvis.

Pure Peaches ran the BON time of 27.51 after leading throughout to score in a Mixed 4th/5th Grade.

Wearing the red vest at \$7.90, the daughter of Pure Octane and Lady Sparkles got there by a neck over Cyclone Ned (\$4.90), with a length to third placed Surfing Boy (\$6.20).

Pure Peaches, who's won nine of her 39 starts, was the second leg of a litter double for owner trainer, Lauren Gorman.

Pure Suspicion was Lauren's first leg and he ran 23.73 to land a 410 metres Mixed 4th/5th Grade.

Shaiane Bale has now started 22 times and this was her fifth win.

Milo Bale was the first leg for Paul and Graeme and he posted 25.95 to take out heat two of the 450 metres Maiden.

Maleek gave Robyn her double by registering 25.80 to land a 450 metres Grade 5.

The daughter of Surf Lorian and Lil Lee came from box four as favourite at \$3.30 to salute by two and a half lengths over Greywinds Dodge (\$4.90) and Vision Of Time (\$6.80), a half length was the margin there.
