Big winners

Shepparton January 18

VIOLET TOWN trainer, Michael Carter took the training honours on Monday night with a double and both were big winners.

Firstly it was Chief Advisor in heat two of the 450 metres Maiden and he led throughout to score in 25.66. The son of Bond and Mid-night Amber came from box two at \$6.30 to bolt in by nine lengths over Patriotic Chore (\$15.60), with Bam Siyan (\$28.60) a neck further away.

Olga Doll for the Cothion Syndicate gave Michael his double by running 25.50 after leading all the way to take out heat one of the Kings vs Queens Grade 5 over 450 metres.

Sent to box one as favourite at \$1.40, the daughter of Where's Pedro and Redburst romped in by eight lengths over Where's Sis (\$16.80), with three quarters of a length to third placed Sanctified (\$40.10).

Bosca Wabbit brought up the hat-trick of wins by running the BON time of 25.47 to take out heat two of the Kings vs Queens Grade 5 over 450 metres.

The Robert Britton trained chaser came from box seven as favourite at \$1.90 to lead throughout and score by five and three quarter lengths over Jimmy Douglas (\$6.90), with Fast Forward (\$13.20) collecting third money, a length away.

Bosca Wabbit, a son of Big Daddy Cool and Awesome Wabbit, has now won five of his eight runs.

There was a Mixed 4th/5th Grade run over the 650 metres and Coco Hoko Poko led throughout to score in 37.85.

The daughter of Bombastic Shiraz and Beilharz Sunrise wore the yellow vest at \$6.10 to a two and a half lengths win over Benji Magic (\$4.60), with Dodgee Tom (\$3.00 fav) a neck further away.

Coco Hoko Poko, who's won nine of her 44 starts, is raced and trained by Corinne and Andrew O'Connor.

Burra Chief took time honours over the 390 metres by registering the new PB of 22.34 to take out a Grade 5.

The Simon Lees trained sprinter came from box six at \$5.70 to beat Cooney's Medal (\$1.60 fav) by four and three quarter lengths, with Jigsaw Lass (\$7.30) collecting third money, a length and three quarters back.

A winner of seven of his 15 outings, Burra Chief is a son of Carnage and Burra Lass.

Tiger tops

NAPOLEON TIGER finished best to take out the 570 metres Grade 5 on Tuesday night.

The Tanya Auld trained chaser came from box two as equal favourite at \$3.20 to defeat co-favourite Time To Speed (\$3.20) by a half length, with two and a quarter lengths to third placed Jersey Bale (\$6.50).

Napoleon Tiger, a son of Molotov and Elite Monelli owned by the McDonald Wright Syndicate, clocked 33.16 when making it three wins in eight runs to date.

Taipan Bale took time honours over the 410 metres by recording 23.50 to take out the Mixed 4th/5th Grade.

Sent to box seven at \$4.40, the son of Solve The Puzzle and Arivada Bale saluted by three lengths over Chainsaw (\$4.80), with Talar Bale (\$36.20) a half length further adrift.

Taipan Bale, a winner of 40 of his 83 starts, was the first of three winners for owner, Paul Wheeler and the first leg of a winning double for trainer, Graeme Bate.

The Steve Collins trained Idelle Bale was Paul Wheeler's second leg and she ran 27.52 to take out heat three of the 480 metres Grade 5. The daughter of Where's Pedro and Saffron Bale wore the black vest at \$20.40 to a three and a half lengths win over General View (\$3.20), with Hudson Bale (\$3.00 fav) three quarters of a length further adrift.

Joseph Bale completed Paul Wheeler's treble and Graeme Bate's double by registering 27.55 when successful in the 480 metres

Free For All.

Rated at \$18.90 out of box three, the son of Black Enforcer and Starlight Bale beat Black Eye (\$4.90) by two and three quarter lengths, with Lord Voldemort (\$22.80) the next to arrive, a length in arrears.

Why Not Giaan ran the BON time of 27.43 when an all the way winner of heat four of the 480 metres Grade 5.

Coming from the inside trap at \$4.70, the Wayne Gray trained chaser scored by two and three quarter lengths over Lily Eve (\$1.50 fav), with Elite Yippee (\$17.80) three quarters of a length back in third spot.

The Bill McMahon trained chaser wore the blue vest at \$19.80 to a three and a half lengths win over Jebrynah's Pride (\$5.80), with a length to third placed Double Jump (\$3.30 fav).

Good Oil took out the 650 metres Grade 5 with a run of 37.69.

Lining up in box eight at \$3.00, the Paul Anderton trained stayer got home best to score by two and a quarter lengths over Pure City (\$6.80), with Arvo's Sphinx (\$2.60 fav) coming in third, a neck away.

A winner of six of her 23 outings, Good Oil is a daughter of Bond and Bayview Ability, owned by Pamela Anderton.

The only 520 metres race on the card was a Grade 5 and Wadelock Tiger took that out in 30.02.

The son of Big Daddy Cool and Princess Dreams came from box five at \$6.30 to account for Bridge Omagh (\$14.20) and Tram Line Penny (\$2.80 fav), the margins were a length and three quarters both ways.

Owned and trained by Michael Clohesy, Wadelock Tiger at his 36th start registered his fourth win.

The son of Bond and Hall's Turbo came from box seven at \$4.00 to score by three and a half lengths over Rellim Rosie (\$5.90), with Sheylea (\$10.00) three quarters of a length further afield.

Hot Price, who recorded the new PB, BON and new track record time of 21.81 to make it 10 wins in 19 starts, is owned by Graeme Euvrard and was the first leg of a winning double for trainer, Jason Thompson.

The Seona Hood owned Who's House completed the double for Jason by clocking

25.57 to take out a 450 metres Grade 5.

Ashby Rose, trained by Angela Langton for the Champagne Syndicate, has now won seven of her 34 outings.
