Quick bonus

Horsham February 9

QUICK RAPIDS picked up the GOBIS Bbonus by taking out the 570 metres Maiden Final on Tuesday night.

Chucky Choda, owned by the Sharden-freud Syndicate, was the first leg of a winning double for trainer, Stan Ralph.

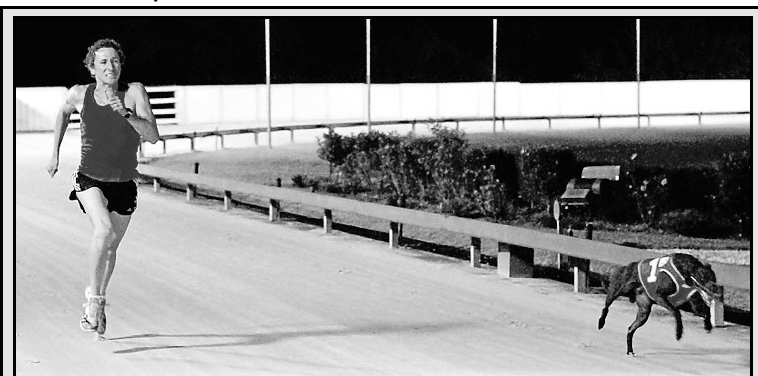
The Hugh Dunkley owned Cyclone Annie completed Stan's double by running 30.20 to take out a 513 metres Maiden.
